GUARDIAN ANGELS

This past week (October 2) was the memorial to The Holy Guardian Angels. A guardian angel is an angel (a created, non-human, non-corporeal being) that has been assigned to guard a particular person, especially with respect to helping that person avoid spiritual dangers and achieve salvation. The angel may also help the person avoid physical dangers, particularly if this will help the person achieve salvation. We don't talk much about these angels, but we do see them many times in Scripture (they sing at the birth of Jesus, protect Him in His infancy, serve Him in the desert, strengthen Him in His agony in the garden, and proclaim the good news of Christ's incarnation and resurrection, and they will be present at Christ's return). Do you know that a Guardian Angel has been specifically appointed for YOU? You may not see them, know their name or gender; but be assured one is working on your behalf. So ask for their help and trust in their watch care.
