

GIVE OF YOURSELF

Hopefully we all had a wonderful Lenten season as we focused on the three pillars of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. Of course, we all know we should continue these works of charitable and loving giving throughout the year, just as Christ would have us do. One way to (literally) give of yourself is to donate blood. The blood bank is open and has significant procedures in place to be in compliance with the government mandates such as social distancing and infection control. They are always in need of donations of various blood products but even more so now with an increase in hospitalizations. By appointment only, Vitalant (formerly Bloodsource) has locations throughout the Sacramento area, but the ones most convenient to the Pocket/Greenhaven area are in midtown and Elk Grove. They have online procedures in place so that you can complete your history information prior to your appointment, thus saving time at the center. A donation of red blood cells takes less than an hour, while donating platelets or plasma will take 1 ½ - 3 hours. What a great way to help others but also feel good about yourself and get out of the house for a worthy cause!!! Give them a call at (916) 453-3000 or (866) 822-5663.

We miss you all and keep you all in prayer as we await the time we can gather together again.

Please stay healthy and safe.

Whenever the health restrictions are lifted, we plan on having a big thanksgiving celebration!

PRESCHOOL: Dependent upon when the health restrictions are lifted, maybe we can have a Sunday morning gathering in June so we can gather one more time this school year. Stay tuned! You can still sing, "When we pray together, God is always with us!"

Classes were discontinued just seven class sessions prior to our summer break; hopefully you walked through Holy Week Liturgies with your family. Here's what we are thinking for the remaining lessons:

PRE SACRAMENTS YEAR 1 & 2 (Ms. Wendy, Ms. Jaime & Melissa, Ms. Dona & Ms. Kate classes)

We will put packets together with this year's remaining chapters. You can complete at home and return them via the parish office mail drop box. We will figure out a 'due date'---Does June 15 sound fair? Stay tuned!

RECONCILIATION/EUCHARIST (Ms. Christine's class)

We will be dropping off your booklets on your doorsteps! We have chapter 4 & 5 to complete...and then you get to read over the Little Catechism in the back of the book. We would like to have our retreat and one 60 minute class session prior to celebrating First Communion. After the health restrictions are lifted, we can ideally schedule First Communion two-three weeks out so we can get those two above items completed. Then we will CELEBRATE! Stay tuned!

POST SACRAMENT 1-2 (Ms. Lisa, Ms. Teresa, Mr. Alejandro & Ms. Linda classes)

Remaining chapters may go home.

Mr. Alejandro's Monday class will have altar server training.

Maybe altar server training for Post Sac (Ms. Lisa & Ms. Teresa's classes) can be conducted! Stay tuned!

PRECONFIRMATION (Mr. Kuhl's class)

We will mail home the remaining chapters. Mr. Kuhl will send a weekly email with a bible reading and his weekly quiz. Mr. Kuhl would like to meet a final time this year to have your Jeopardy tournament. (And maybe you have Kuhl cash you need to spend!) Stay tuned!

BASIC CATECHESIS/RCIA YEAR 1 (Ms. Linda's class)

Once the health restrictions are lifted, we will have one 90 minute FAMILY SESSION to review our year and to discuss what comes next in this process. Stay tuned!

RCIA YEAR 2 (Ms. Vicky's class)

While we are not able to celebrate the Initiation Rites at Easter Vigil, we will still be celebrating!! The Diocese has assigned us the Pentecost Vigil (May 30) to celebrate if all goes well! Stay tuned!

CONFIRMATION YEAR 1

We had a parent/student session scheduled for April 29----It has moved to another month! For now, make sure you are completing your saint page and have returned your sponsor sheet. The retreat scheduled for May 29 may or may not be moved to another date.

CONFIRMATION YEAR 2

Our April 26 Confirmation date has officially been postponed. The Diocese will reschedule Confirmations once the health restrictions are lifted. Once we have a new date and details, we will let you know. Stay tuned! One day we will have our wonderful celebration! For now: Leftover folders will be sent home. Students now have longer than April 3 to turn them in! (Let's say three weeks prior to our next scheduled Confirmation date.) If your folder is complete, feel free to it turn it in now—the parish has a 24 hour mail slot right next to the parish office door. (Located by the back parking lot.) Just alert us when you drop it off so we can look for it.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR

Hopefully you are singing joyfully at home! Hopefully, we can still sing for First Communion. When we have a new First Communion date, we will see if we can squeeze in a rehearsal and lead the celebration in song! Stay tuned!

KEEPING FAITH IN THE TIME OF CHALLENGE!

Our situation is confusing and frightening for hundreds of millions of people. That is not surprising. Many around the world are sick and many others have died. Unless the situation changes dramatically, many more will fall ill and die around the globe. This crisis raises many questions, but it raises as well for people of faith.

"Do not be afraid!" as Jesus said many times, and take actions.

Trust that God is with you. Many people, especially those who are sick, may feel a sense of isolation that compounds their fear.

At the same time, we know that Jesus understands our suffering and accompanies us in the most intimate of ways. Remember that during his public ministry Jesus spent a great deal of time with those who were sick. And before modern medicine, almost any infection could kill you. Thus, lifespans were short: only 30 or 40 years. In other words, Jesus knew the world of illness.

Jesus, then, understands all the fears and worries that you have. Jesus understands you, not only because he is divine and understands all things but because he is human and experienced all things. Go to him in prayer. And trust that he hears you and is with you.

Trust in my prayers, too. We will move through this together, with God's help.
