

We will continue to livestream Mass on Sunday's at 9:00 a.m. We will also have a daily Mass on Wednesday's at 9:00 a.m.


Beginning May 3, we will be moving to the YOUTUBE platform. You will find the link for the Mass on our website.

In today's Gospel reading, we hear of one of the many appearances Jesus made after His resurrection and before His ascension into Heaven. On the road to Emmaus, they did not recognize Jesus initially, but later did when He shared a meal with them. When He appeared to Mary Magdalene, she did not realize who He was until He spoke her name. The disciples in last week's Gospel reading thought they were seeing a ghost; but once Jesus showed them His hands and His feet, they knew it was their Lord. Peter and the others fishing only distinguished Jesus after they overfilled their empty fishing nets at His direction. While other appearances are recorded, we do not really know how many times Jesus revealed Himself after His resurrection. But He has promised that He will return and reveal Himself to us again. Will you know Him? Will He know you?

Whenever the health restrictions are lifted, we plan on having a big thanksgiving celebration!

PRESCHOOL: Dependent upon when the health restrictions are lifted, maybe we can have a Sunday morning gathering in June so we can gather one more time this school year. Stay tuned! You can still sing, "When we pray together, God is always with us!"

Classes were discontinued just seven class sessions prior to our summer break; hopefully you walked through Holy Week Liturgies with your family. Here is what we are thinking for the remaining lessons:

PRE SACRAMENTS YEAR 1 & 2 (Ms. Wendy, Ms. Jaime & Melissa, Ms. Dona & Ms. Kate classes)

We will put packets together with this year's remaining chapters. You can complete at home and return them via the parish office mail drop box. We will figure out a 'due date'---Does June 15 sound fair? Stay tuned!

RECONCILIATION/EUCHARIST (Ms. Christine's class)

We will be dropping off your booklets on your doorsteps! We have chapters 4 & 5 to complete...and then you get to read over the Little Catechism in the back of the book. We would like to have our retreat and one 60 minute class session prior to celebrating First Communion. After the health restrictions are lifted, we can ideally schedule First Communion two-three weeks out so we can get those two above items completed. Then we will CELEBRATE! Stay tuned!

POST SACRAMENT 1-2 (Ms. Lisa, Ms. Teresa, Mr. Alejandro & Ms. Linda classes)

Remaining chapters may go home.

Mr. Alejandro's Monday class will have altar server training.

Maybe altar server training for Post Sac (Ms. Lisa & Ms. Teresa's classes) can be conducted! Stay tuned!

PRECONFIRMATION (Mr. Kuhl's class)

We will mail home the remaining chapters. Mr. Kuhl will send a weekly email with a bible reading and his weekly quiz. Mr. Kuhl would like to meet a final time this year to have your Jeopardy tournament. (And maybe you have Kuhl cash you need to spend!) Stay tuned!

BASIC CATECHESIS/RCIA YEAR 1 (Ms. Linda's class)

We had a parent/student session scheduled for April 29----It has moved to another month! For now, make sure you are completing your saint page and have returned your sponsor sheet. The retreat scheduled for May 29 may or may not be moved to another date.

Our April 26 Confirmation date has officially been postponed. The Diocese will reschedule Confirmations once the health restrictions are lifted. Once we have a new date and details, we will let you know. Stay tuned! One day we will have our wonderful celebration! For now: Leftover folders will be sent home. Students now have longer than April 3 to turn them in! (Let's say three weeks prior to our next scheduled Confirmation date.) If your folder is complete, feel free to it turn it in now—the parish has a 24 hour mail slot right next to the parish office door. (Located by the back parking lot.) Just alert us when you drop it off so we can look for it.
