
# YOUNG@HEART LUNCHEON

# SAVE THE DATE: CIVIL RIGHTS IN THE SOUTH TOUR OCTOBER 12-17

The St. Anthony Social Justice Ministry Team's Racial Justice Committee has been studying issues of racial justice within the United States and the Church for the past few years. To experience and continue to learn about the Civil Rights movement, the Committee is inviting you to join us on a tour to Alabama where many historic events occurred and are documented. Mark Hoffman—Sports Leisure Vacations, is offering this tour through his agency and has prepared an itinerary based upon the Committee's specific requests.

Brief highlights of the tour include the following cities in Alabama: Birmingham (Civil Rights Institute, 16th Street Baptist Church); Montgomery (Rosa Parks Museum, The Legacy Museum, the National Memorial for Peace and Justice and the Freedom Monument Sculpture Park); Selma (meet and walk with Ms. Joanne Bland, civil rights activist and eye witness to historic local events); Tuskegee (Airmen at Moton Field). The tour will end in Atlanta, Georgia (Martin Luther King, Jr. Historic Site). A full itinerary will be made available to those interested by signing a list located in the church narthex.


The tour price is \$3,165 per person/double occupancy (sharing a room); \$3,650 single (not sharing a room). The package includes transportation from your home to Sacramento airport and return, round trip air fare; fees for one checked bag on return flight, and the services of a Sports Leisure Tour Director. Also included: 12 meals (5 breakfasts, 4 lunches and 3 dinners), hotel accommodations, motor coach transportation during the trip, all admissions including guide gratuities for attractions listed and gratuities to the coach driver. Pricing is based upon a minimum of 22 travelers, with a maximum of 28.

On Wednesday, May 15 at 7:00 p.m. in the Memorial Center, Mark Hoffman will be presenting the tour details and answering any questions. Reservations for the tour will need to be made by May 31. An \$800 deposit to secure the reservation will be required by June 10. Trip cancellation insurance is available for an additional fee.

# POPE FRANCIS HAS APPOINTED FATHER REY BERSABAL AUXILIARY BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO



The Vatican Press Office announced that His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed Rev. Rey Bersabal, a priest from the Diocese of Sacramento, as auxiliary bishop in the Diocese of Sacramento. He will take up his appointment on May 31, following his ordination as bishop in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament.

"I am grateful to His Holiness for giving me a faithful disciple of the Lord Jesus as an able co-worker in this favored part of His vineyard," said the Most Rev. Jaime Soto, Bishop of Sacramento.

"Bishop-elect Rey came as an immigrant priest bringing the rich cultural heritage of the Filipino people. He became part of a presbyterate and people that is a global Catholic kaleidoscope of faith and charity radiating the historic credal customs from Portugal, Italy, Ireland, China, Poland, Africa and more."

Bishop-elect Bersabal, 59, the youngest of three children born to Juanita Guzman Bendijo and Ananias Amparo Bersabal, grew up in a small town in Mindanao, Philippines. His vocation to the priesthood began with the lived Faith of his parents and family. He attended both Catholic and public schools before entering the diocesan seminary of San Jose de Mindanao. He obtained his degree in Philosophy from Ateneo de Cagayan Xavier University. On April 29, 1991 he was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Cagayan de Oro.

In 1999, at the invitation of Bishop Emeritus William Weigand, Bishop-elect Bersabal came to the Diocese of Sacramento. He was incardinated into the diocese in 2004. In the 25 years since his arrival, he has served in several ministerial and administrative positions. Since 2022, he has served as Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Parish, Sacramento and is currently a member of the Priests Personnel Board and the Independent Review Board. Previous assignments include chaplain of the Davis Newman Center and pastor assignments at St. Paul Parish, Sacramento, St. John the Baptist Parish, Folsom, and St. James Parish, Davis.

"I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to His Holiness Pope Francis and to Bishop Jaime Soto, for the recognition and trust bestowed upon me." said Bishop-elect Bersabal. "I am humbled to be chosen to serve God's people in this capacity. I vow to uphold the responsibility to demonstrate Christ's holiness to the people of the Diocese of Sacramento."

As Auxiliary Bishop, Bersabal will also serve as Vicar General for the Diocese of Sacramento while remaining Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Parish.

Bishop-elect Bersabal speaks English, Tagalog, Visayan and Spanish.

- Kindly protect exposed terminals (9V) from short-circuit by individually bagging or taping terminals.
