ROMANS

This is the fourth in a 7-week series to briefly explore the “who, what, when, where, and why” of Paul’s Letter to the Romans from which our second readings comes until September 13. Who is Paul, who are the Romans, and what Romans is about were discussed in weeks 1, 2 and 3. Where and when was Romans written? Paul had been preaching the good news of Jesus Christ for over a decade, so his Letters are very mature and refined. He had already made three missionary journeys to various places skirting the Mediterranean Sea to what is now modern day southern and central Turkey, and in the second, Greece was also included. He writes his Letter to the Romans at the end of his third journey in late AD 57 or early 58 from Corinth or a nearby port which is on an island to the west of Greece. Most Biblical scholars agree that Romans was the last written of the his New Testament Letters and is seen as a summary of his thought, composed as his career moved toward its conclusion.

Application to our life. *We do not know when we will be at the end of our life’s journey, so we need to live each day to its fullest and ensure our relationships and spiritual life are in order.*

EZE CYPRIAN AHANEKU FOUNDATION



CFF & YM 2020-21 SCHOOL YEAR PLAN

Ms. Linda and I want to share our plan moving forward in the fall for CFF. We appreciate your patience as we took time this summer to learn of daily news, updates and changes regarding the health and safety of students, their families, and teachers/staff, from local school districts and our Diocese. Following guidelines put forth by the Diocese and in compliance with health restrictions, CFF will start in October 2020 with a CFF Home School Model for the fall consisting of:

- CFF & YM Registration beginning late August.
- A monthly gathering for CFF & YM at the beginning of each month to meet your child's catechist and pick-up his/her monthly CFF/YM packet while keeping with all social distancing guidelines. Packets for each student are to be completed at home and returned at the next monthly gathering.
- A 30-minute, semi-monthly online gathering hosted by each catechist for his/her respective class.
- St. Anthony Youth Ministry weekly online gatherings will continue. Junior High and High School Ministry have been gathering online 2-3 times a week since March 2020. Online gatherings include Sunday Evening Prayer and Youth Nights.
- We will continue to evaluate our program throughout the fall while following the newest and latest health restrictions and guidelines. We hope to return to classes in person in January 2021 but will continue to update you as we go. Please continue to stay updated and check communications from the CFF & YM Office via email and the weekly bulletin.

Along with Fr. Mitch and our parish staff, thank you for your understanding during this time. The safety, health, and well-being of our CFF families, catechists, and overall parish community continue to be our top priority as we move forward. Thank you for your patience as we continue to work to ensure the spiritual health of our youth, families and volunteers. Please continue to pray, and keep hope and faith for an end to this pandemic. We continue to pray for each of you and that joyful day we can gather and celebrate together again.
