THE HOLY EUCHARIST - PART 7

(Seventh in a series of reflections on the mystery of Our Lord's real presence in the Holy Eucharist.)

The Communion Procession at Mass is a sign of the pilgrim Church, the body of those who believe in Christ, on their way to the Heavenly Jerusalem. At Christ's invitation, extended by the priest acting in Christ's person: "Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb," the members of the community move forward to share in the sacred meal.

The fact that the Communion Procession is a profoundly religious action tells us something about the way in which we should participate in this procession. We're not just "waiting in line" like at the market or motor vehicle office.
