#### **KNOW YOUR RIGHTS INFORMATION SESSION**

All people in the United States, including immigrants, have constitutional rights and protections. To learn what your rights are and how to assert them if confronted by ICE or the police, attend a free information session on Sunday, July 20, 2025, 2:00-3:30 pm, online in English and Spanish.

Speakers will discuss our Catholic Diocese's support for immigrants, and provide guidance on immigrants' rights in public places, their homes and cars, at work, in court, or in immigration or police custody. The session will also outline ways for people to assist immigrants in claiming their rights and explain how to obtain free or low-cost immigration legal services.



This event is organized by St. Anthony Parish's Immigrant Advocacy Committee, with speakers from the Diocesan Immigrant Support Network (DISN) and Sacramento Area Congregations Together (SacACT).
