

ADOPT-A-FAMILY FOR CHRISTMAS

The wish lists for the families participating in our Adopt-a-Family for Christmas program are available after the Masses THIS weekend, November 23-24. If vou were unable to pick up a wish list and would like to participate, please contact Maureen Sergent. There are many families in need this Christmas and we can obtain additional wish lists if we have more who would like to participate. We are working with Family Promise of Sacramento and Wellspring Women's Center to help families who have recently transitioned from homelessness into housing or are facing significant financial hardship. This program is a very tangible way to make a big difference in the lives of families in need this Christmas season. Adopting an entire family on your own can be intimidating, so we encourage you to adopt a family as a group or we can pair you with others to adopt just one or two people from a family or even individual items on the wish list. You can also donate towards the sponsorship of a family or child. We will use the money to fill in items on the families lists. We are also requesting donations of new or gently used bikes. Bikes are a one of the most requested items on the children's lists, but they are often more than the sponsor families can manage along with the other gifts. If you

have a bike your children or grandchildren have outgrown, we have a child it would fit, from toddler to adult size. We have also had requests for adult bikes to provide transportation to work. Helmets and bike locks are also greatly appreciated. We do ask that the bikes be in good condition. Thank you for your generous support of this program. PARISH LIFE

END OF LIFE PLANNING

Making decisions when facing serious or life-threatening illness is not easy. Life becomes uncertain and fear can overwhelm us. But examining our wishes and desires with family and health care providers ahead of time will make it easier for us, our loved ones and our health care team. Understanding our faith and knowing where to turn for support can help us find peace of mind during a frightening time.

The parish office contains a number of resources to help us explore our wishes and communicate them clearly to family and health care providers. The office has an extensive file of materials, including, samples of an advance care directive; physician orders for life-sustaining treatment (POLST); a power of attorney; medication safety checklist; helpful hints on talking about dementia, and many other materials on the church's Passionate Voice for Compassionate Care/Whole Person Care Initiative. Materials are also available from the California Catholic Conference of Bishops (www.cacatholic.org/embracing-our-dying) for guidance on Catholic moral and ethical teachings as well the legal forms needed to make sure our wishes are respected. The Catholic Health Association of States also provides useful (www.chausa.org/palliative/palliative-care) especially in dealing with health professionals. A little preparation and discussion today will help us all feel loved, worth and cared for during any serious illness or when approaching the end of life.
