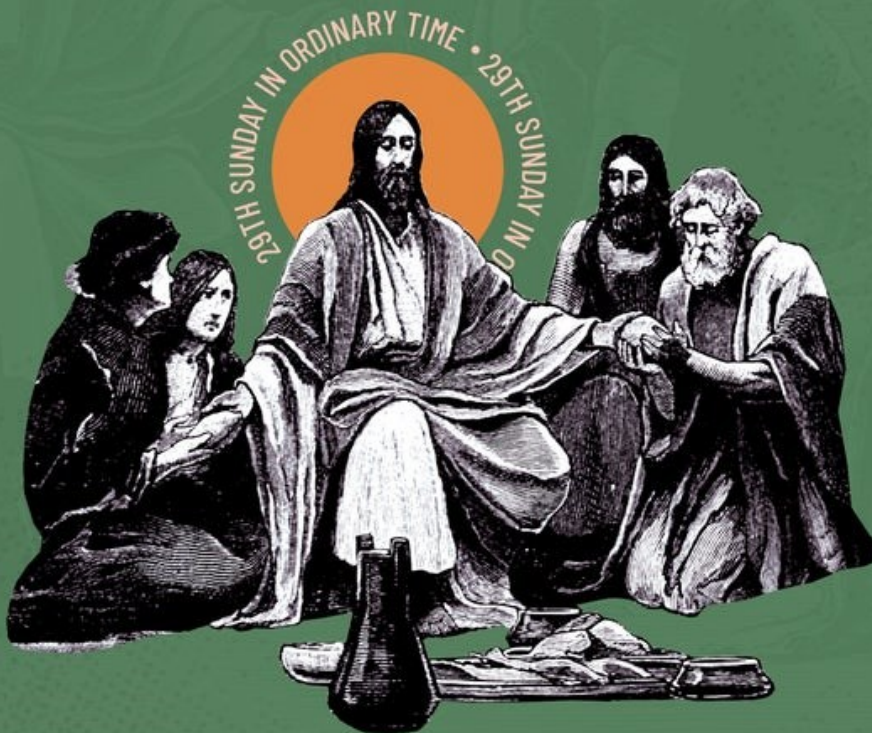

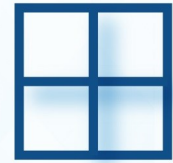

## PASTORAL CARE MINISTRY

We are currently blessed with 19 ministers in the Pastoral Care ministry. That may sound like a lot, but it is not sufficient to meet the needs in our community. We serve at almost 100 people at nine care facilities and 12 private residents on a weekly basis. Some ministers are now having to do triple (or more) duties. All ministers will tell you what a blessing this ministry is to visit briefly with these lonely Catholics and bring the Body of Christ to those who can no longer attend Mass. Training to become a Pastoral Care minister will be offered the end of October or early November and will initially take about one hour of your time. There are some Diocesan mandatory requirements to do at your own pace but should only take about two hours. Less than one hour of "on-the-job" training is provided with experienced ministers before you venture out on your own to ensure you feel comfortable with the process. When all is completed, Father Mitch will commission and bless you at one of the weekend Masses to serve the Lord and His people in this ministry. On Saturday, October 26, right after the 5:00 p.m. Mass, a video called LIFE AFTER LOCKUP will be shown in the Memorial Center. The documentary, put together by the Public Broadcasting System (PBS), follows four people as they try to navigate re-entering the community after being incarcerated.
