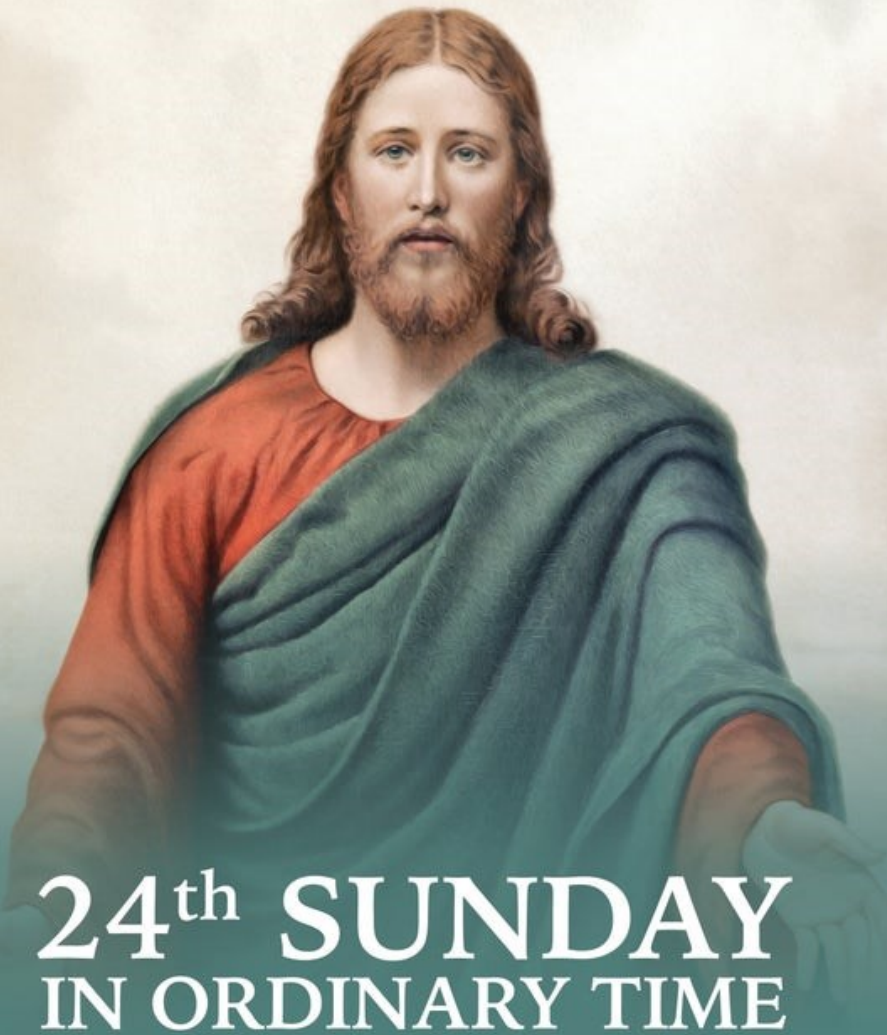

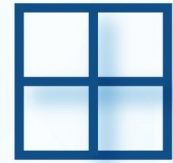

CYCLE OF MASS READINGS

Do you ever wonder why we hear various parts of the Bible read at Mass? There is a prescribed cycle of readings which was established by the Second Vatican Council to help Catholics become more familiar with the Bible. The Catholic Church's cycle of readings is organized into three-year cycles, labeled A, B, and C, that begin on the first Sunday of Advent. The first reading on Sunday is usually from the Old Testament, but during Easter it comes from the Acts of the Apostles. Each year's Gospel reading is based on a single Evangelist, with Year A being Matthew, Year B being Mark, and Year C being Luke. The Psalm often reflects a theme from the Gospel. We are currently reading cycle B (and you can always find that on the page in the Breaking Bread book right after the index). Similarly the weekday Mass reading cycle is divided into two years, Year I and Year II. Year I is read in odd-numbered years (2025 and 2027, etc.) and Year II is used in even-numbered years (2024 and 2026, etc.). During the year, the daily Mass Gospels are read semi-continuously, beginning with Mark, then moving on to Matthew and Luke. Since May 19, 2002 all readings for the dioceses of the United States are based on the New American Bible.

ST. ANTHONY PARISH ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE 5TH SUNDAY COLLECTION

September 29, 2024, will be the 5th Sunday Collection for St. Anthony Parish St. Vincent de Paul. The group helps those in our neighborhood with an urgent need for help with rent and utilities. Many of the families we help also struggle with food insecurity. We provide grocery store gift cards if there is an immediate need of food. We also provide information about the SSIP Food Closet, a ministry also supported by our parish. It is through your generosity we can help a senior on a small-fixed income, an unemployed worker, or a single mom or dad struggling to meet the needs of their children. For the month of August, we assisted 57 clients, including children, with approximately \$9,300 for rent, SMUD, and PG&E as well as providing food cards and money vouchers to the SVdP Thrift Store. Those that we serve are so grateful for the parish's generosity. Donations can be made at the Saturday and Sunday masses, mailed to the parish office, or dropped off at the office mail-drop. Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
