FAITHFUL CITIZENSHIP SPONSORED BY ST. ANTHONY SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

Political Engagement and our Baptismal Call: In their statement on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the U.S. Catholic bishops remind Catholics about the call to participate in political life. "In the Catholic tradition," they write, "responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation" (no. 13). With this point in mind, we are planning several events to respond to our bishops' recommendations.

First, we want to encourage voter registration. We will be at all the Masses the weekend of September 28-29 to help people register. If you have moved, changed your name or want to change political party, you must update your registration. With the election on November 5, the registration deadline is October 21.

Secondly, we are working jointly with other Pocket Area churches to hold in person information sessions about various issues on the November ballot. We will NOT be endorsing any candidates or telling anyone how to vote. That is yours to decide. Our effort will be help you to be well informed when you do vote. Stay tuned for more information.

CARE FOR CREATION MINISTRY (CCM)

The Season of Creation begins on September 1, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on October 4. the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations. The theme of this year's Season of Creation is "To Hope & Act with Creation". The Season of Creation was added to the Catholic liturgical calendar by Pope Francis as a natural way to respond with urgent, prayerful action to the ecological crises facing Earth, to collaborate with the global ecumenical community on these critical issues, and to implement the faith vision, analysis and mission laid out in his 2015 encyclical. Laudato Sí. In 2021, the Vatican launched the <u>Laudato Sí Action</u> <u>Platform (LSAP)</u> designed to call all parts of the global Catholic community—from families to parishes to businesses, schools, healthcare institutions, religious communities, and more- into extensive coordinated action. Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
